Smoke-free Campus: Milestones

1

- **Jan 12, 2023:** Legislative Yuan passed amendments for a **comprehensive campus smoking ban and raised the smoking age to 20**, effective starting March 2023.

2

- **End of February 2023:** Removed smoking areas
- Restarted work groups
- **March 1, 2023:** officially implemented a *smoke-free campus*

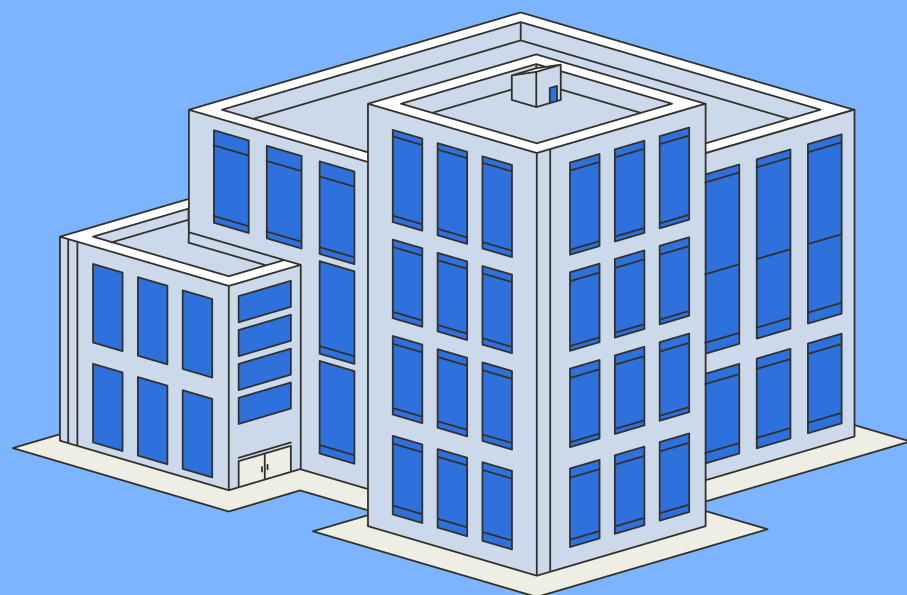

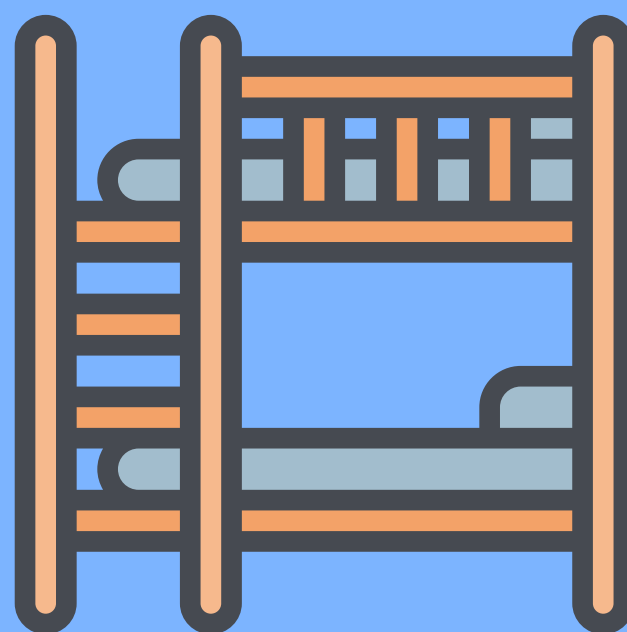

Tobacco Control Laws and Regulations



Anyone can report smoking violations; health authorities may impose fines ranging from **2,000 to 10,000 NTD** for violations.

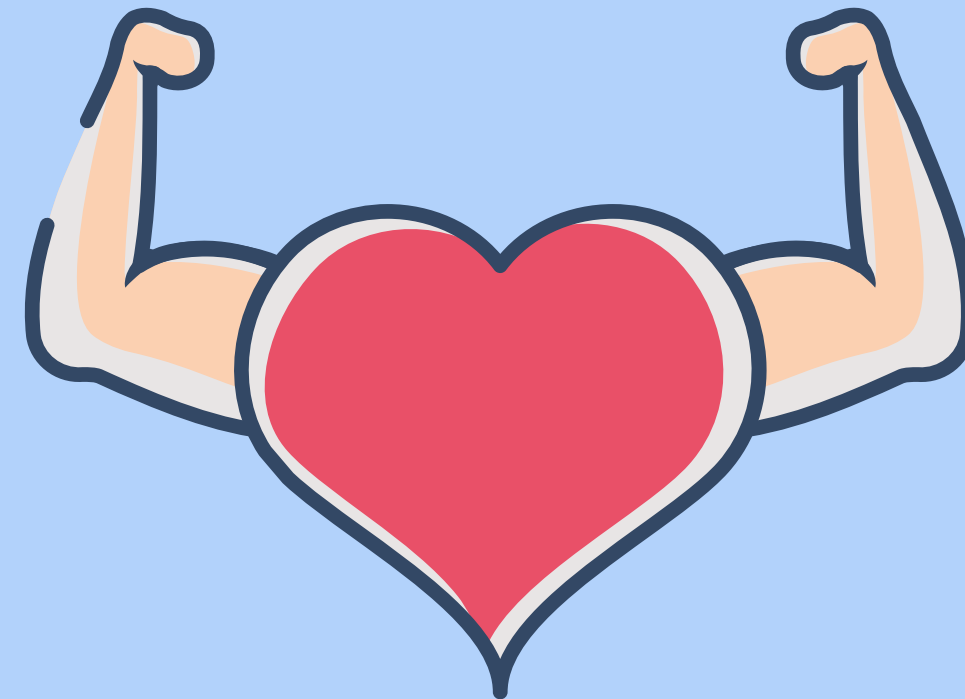
